The Koo's "Giving" Charitable Foundation

The Koo's Giving Charitable Foundation was set up in memory of Mr Koo and his

wife, Madam Yih, who arrived in Hong Kong from Shanghai in the aftermath of the

World War II. Working his way up from his apprenticeship in the chemical

manufacturing industry, Mr Koo went on to build a business empire, which included

both real estate development as well as business management activities.

Formed in 2010 by family members in remembrance of Mr Koo and his wife, the

foundation's aim is to lend a helping hand where it is needed, providing the

underprivileged with an opportunity to lead rewarding lives as productive members

of their community. In 2014, celebrating the centennial of Mr Koo's birth in 1914 as

well as the approaching centennial in 2015 of his wife's birth, the foundation geared

up its activities. As a result, the charity began to work closely with a number of

organizations in Hong Kong to sponsor the development of autistic children, who

with the proper learning and development, are often able to grow up to hold jobs,

develop meaningful relationships and lead normal lives.

To this end the foundation is sponsoring a number of projects. These include

learning and development programs for 100 autistic children over the next four

years. Aware of the importance of parents and their involvement in the success of

these programs, the foundation is also working to establish an educational kit on

autistic learning and development. This kit will provide information and materials

for parents to help their children while they are waiting to be admitted into more

formalized and structured programs.
